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MESSAGE | INTRODUCTION

11 years after founding **Academia dos Champs (ADC)**, I think I have enough elements to be able to draw some conclusions about the third sector in Portugal, and also about some important aspects to take into account in the management of an IPSS (Private Institution of Social Solidarity). In the introduction to this annual report, I have decided to focus on the **importance of professionalizing the IPSS** and on the way how I think their relations with potential patrons should be structured.

What I observe in the specific case of Portugal, with regard to the existence of a corporate and governmental culture geared towards social economy, is that we are still a long way behind, especially in comparison to the Anglo-Saxon countries.

It is inevitable that there will be differences between a Portuguese IPSS, **inserted in a country with very limited financial resources** and, for example, an American non-profit organization, inserted in a context where **a strong entrepreneurial culture of giving back to society** is rooted; it is a fact that it's a culture strongly motivated in part by the existence of high tax benefits, but not exclusively for that reason. In Portugal's case, these benefits are almost materially irrelevant.



In countries such as the USA, where companies generate high profits, due to the size of the markets where they operate, the majority of the institutions have long since adopted a management model where a relevant importance is given to social economy. It is very common for these companies to have in their staff full-time professionals exclusively dedicated to monitoring the causes they support, or to finding new causes to support.

This does not mean that **in Portugal** this does not happen, but obviously on a much smaller scale, due to the smaller size of the economy. Regardless of these factors, **there is certainly a long way to go**.



MESSAGE | **INTRODUCTION**

The truth is that it is a huge challenge to get funding to ensure the sustainability of projects like ADC. It is a common problem for most national IPSS. Many of them rely on a funding structure that is highly concentrated in a small group of patrons, who are not much involved in the daily operation of the organization they support or in its activities. But as we embrace the difficult mission of reaching out to those in need, other huge challenges arise where we least expect it. And they are not only related to their funding.







Securing a group of silent partners who finance the costs of the activity is undoubtedly a great help, but it will not be enough to ensure success in fulfilling its mission. When the patrons are individuals or institutions, leaders and opinion makers in the sector in which they operate, their intervention in the daily life of the IPSS becomes even more important. Not only can their network help to give more visibility to the project, thus making the work of the fundraising team easier, but also their experience, partners and employees can help to leverage the professionalization of the IPSS itself.

The more professional the IPSS management model is, supported by a structure and rules similar to those of a normal company, the easier it will be to gather support from private and public entities.

In the same way, it is necessary and desirable that more and more leaders implement in their companies an assumed culture of social responsibility. Not only regarding the marketing strategy, but that a percentage of their budget is allocated to social economy, either with financial support or with professional integration.

In addition to this issue, in my opinion, it is also part of the mission of an IPSS to **instigate a social culture in private or public institutions**, with which it seeks to gather support. How can this be done? By seeking, for example, to better understand its reality and communication policies, adjusting the reporting model of the IPSS' activities to the **needs of each potential patron**.



MESSAGE | **INTRODUCTION**

After these considerations, let us focus on the main point of this message:

We must not think that the resources of a non-profit organisation should be managed differently from those of a normal company, where managers are rewarded for their profits. The big difference between the two is that you should not evaluate the performance of an IPSS using metrics similar to those used in a normal company. Whereas in a normal company, financial results are a measure of its performance, in a IPSS what matters is the success with which it has fulfilled its mission and whether it has made a positive and lasting impact on its beneficiaries.

At ADC, we focus on issues such as strategy, planning and discipline on a daily basis. Discipline of the team, discipline of governance, discipline of allocation and efficient resources management and discipline in decision making. We consider internal reporting to be very important, as it will contribute to a better external reporting.

When we meet with a potential patron, we should be able to gather evidence, both quantitative and qualitative, that we are succeeding in implementing our mission. We must convey confidence and show that there is a process, a leadership. Leadership only exists when people follow a cause or someone, even when they have the freedom not to do so. This is only possible when the leader is strongly motivated, contagious and motivating those who speak with him, be it a collaborator or a patron.

The combination of tangible results and emotion will make those on the other side believe, not only in our mission, but also in our ability to implement it. It easily identifies that there is a disciplined team, an organized line of thought and planned actions. Even if not for profit, organizations like ADC must be structured like any other large organization, and it is their responsibility to be transparent and to produce quality and timely information; information and reporting that convinces and motivates existing or potential partners or patrons.

This is the main function of the annual reports that we produce. Over the next few pages, you can see what our year of 2019 has been like.




9. VALUES AND PRINCIPLES CONVEYED

- JOY | Sports practice, by contributing to a healthier lifestyle, also allows us to face daily challenges with greater confidence and optimism.



FIGHTING SCHOOL DROPOUT AND MONITORING



The fact that we assume a significant role in the scheduling of their extracurricular activities gives us an increased responsibility, but at the same time, allows us to reinforce the work carried out by the schools.

From the various motivational tools provided to our students, we would like to highlight the presentation of the ANNUAL MERIT AWARD - specially designed for each student to achieve the best overall results. Combining sporting, academic and behavioural performance, in a joint evaluation among coaches, social partners and schools, we reward the most dedicated students of the school year, thus recognising their **commitment** and **ability to excel**.

SOCIAL INCLUSION

Choosing a sport that is not accessible to all, that is absent from curricular plans and with scarce penetration in the neighbourhoods where **Academia dos Champs** operates is our contribution to the democratization of access to sports as an individual right that all citizens are entitled to. By putting into practice the motto "SPORTS FOR ALL" — in this particular case, it shows that tennis can be played by all youngsters.

On a daily basis, the inclusion of the students is accomplished through several activities, organized by **Academia dos Champs** or by our associate partners, such as:

- Integration in our partners' social events (BNP Paribas and Carcavelos Ténis)
- Tennis tournaments and clinics
- Management tasks at charity events (WAT Cup BNP Paribas and Teen Alive Aid)
- Ball Kids at the Millennium Estoril Open

PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVEL

Along with monitoring the sports development of our students, during training we also provide tools to help them **develop personal and social faculties**, which will help them to become better adults. Their commitment towards tennis lessons (ideally twice a week), and the constant goals that are presented to them, allow us to instil values of **discipline**, **persistence**, **dedication** and **resilience** — which in turn enhance **self-esteem**, **self-worth** and **confidence**.

Tennis lessons provide a different environment from that in which lessons are usually given to youngsters, helping to break down some barriers. Due to the informality and the strong bond created between tennis coaches and students, reinforced by the individual nature of this sport, training sessions allow youngsters not only to have the technical knowledge, but also a greater and more efficient emotional development.





EDUCATION, TRAINING AND CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

In addition to monitoring their academic performance, the students of **Academia dos Champs**, through the institutional support provided to our project by the Portuguese Tennis Federation (FPT), have privileged access to tennis training courses. This way, they can acquire skills and tools that can be decisive for them to have a successful professional life — both inside and outside the scope of **Academia dos Champs**.

- Attendance at FPT Tennis Coach Courses
- Attendance at FPT Tennis Umpire Courses
- Ball Kids and Line Judges Training Courses at the Millennium Estoril Open

If we can engage our students professionally in a project from which themselves have benefited in the past, it closes a cycle of youth empowerment — which we naturally seek to replicate in other tennis-related organisations (e.g. clubs), with which we create strategic partnerships.

The best examples that we have been able to put into practice so far are personified in the students Luis Pereira and Filipe Pereira who, under the Tempo Jovem programme of the Oeiras City Council (in a first phase) and later paid by Academia dos Champs, carry out their functions as instructors in the Pinto Basto center, in Outurela.

HEALTH AND PROMOTION OF AN ACTIVE AND HEALTHY LIFE

Regular sports practice **fights sedentarism** and **child obesity** and helps **prevent deviant behaviours** such as **drug abuse** or **delinquency** among youngsters.

Therefore, we try to provide each student with at least **two tennis lessons per week** (or more, depending on their school calendar), integrating the youngsters in small and homogeneous groups, always taking into consideration their technical level and age, thus maximizing their progress and the quality of the lessons.






HEALTH AND PROMOTION OF AN ACTIVE AND HEALTHY LIFE

Access to regular sports practice is one of the most valuable assets that **Academia dos Champs** makes available free of charges to its students, always reinforced by the concern to ensure comprehensive partnerships in the field of health.

It is in this context that the partnership with José de Mello Group arises, in the first place, allowing the students of Academia dos Champs to benefit from a complete medical examination, which at a later stage may complement their affiliation with the Portuguese Tennis Federation. In 2019, the family of partners was strengthened, with Essilor ensuring eye health screening in all centers of our project.

All the **Academia dos Champs** centers are properly equipped with first aid kits, as a result of the protocol signed with **Silveira Pharmacies** — which extend their support to the project with the provision of over-the-counter or prescription medicines to all students who need them.

SPECIFIC RESULTS OF THE WORK CARRIED OUT





THE TEAM

COORDINATION AND APPROACH

With a multidisciplinary team, the various tasks of the project are divided into the technical, operations and pedagogical areas — respectively run by Jorge Dias, Francisco Alvim and Débora Fernandes; the universe of partnerships and fundraising, which is under the management and leadership of Inês Abreu; and the general coordination of **Academia dos Champs**, which is under the responsibility of Pedro Carvalho (also responsible for the communication area). The management of all the centers and monitoring of student progress are accounted for in quarterly reports, with the coordination of the centers being made in the field — with training centers in the North and South of Portugal receiving visits at least once a month - and with regular meetings with the coaching staff and all the social partners of **Academia dos Champs**.

COACHES

All the **Academia dos Champs'** coaches are duly certified, thus offering a guarantee of quality in the teaching of tennis — according to the standards of the "Play and Stay" programme of the **International Tennis Federation**. Besides their technical skills, the coaches have also strong educational skills, which allow them to meet the different challenges that arise in everyday life with the students of **Academia dos Champs**. At the same time, they play a decisive role in passing on the human values that are one of the main cornerstones of the whole project.








This chart shows the progress of the number of tennis lessons given at **Academia** dos Champs between 2010 and 2019 - with the consequent growth of the project, we reached the relevant mark of 16,000 free tennis lessons for all students!

In the calendar year 2019, we dealt with the suspension of activity at the Bicesse center, due to the inability of the social partner to provide the necessary follow-up to the **Academia dos Champs** project, despite having 12 students enrolled — but at the same time it was possible to increase the number of classes in the different centers, bringing the total number of classes closer to the average recorded since 2014.





EVALUATION

The evaluation of the students is made jointly by **Academia dos Champs** and the other partners of the project (social service technicians and teaching staff), based on an identical scale - from 1 to 5 - thus simplifying the comparative analysis and aggregation of the different results.

In the technical field, the evaluations are carried out by the **Academia dos Champs'** coaching staff, taking into account the student's level and performance in the various aspects of the game, whether in a class or tournament environment.

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The assessment of emotional skills is always made together with the social partners of each center and the schools. Within the analysis of the **Academia dos Champs'** coaches, attention is paid to the students' ability to concentrate, their motivation, group attitude, tolerance to adversity, resilience and commitment.

The monitoring of the students' school performance is another of the priorities of **Academia dos Champs**, with the final grades being crucial to the overall analysis. Monitoring is carried out at each term of the school year, using specific models of action, according to the students' ages, so that their motivation is constant throughout the school year.

It is particularly important to emphasize that each center has its own reality, which must be taken into account and monitored separately.




EVALUATION

RESULTS

The pattern of results registered in the 2018-2019 school year has made it possible to notice a consistency in the averages achieved, without significant differences among the various centers of **Academia dos Champs**.

Regarding academic performance, the best average was recorded in the Maia center (3.81), while at the technical level, the most outstanding average value (3.31) was recorded in the Fontaínhas center, in Cascais.



Regarding behaviour, whose evaluation comprises assiduity, discipline, attitude and commitment towards daily work of **Academia dos Champs**, all average grades are positive - with a natural emphasis to the 4.09 mark recorded in Alcabideche.

Outurela and **Maia** both averaged 3.37, followed by **Alcabideche** with 3.34, leading us to believe that the commitment and dedication of the students to the project is growing steadily over the years.



EVALUATION

IMPACT ASSESSMENT

It is perhaps one of the greatest challenges that **Academia dos Champs** faces, for which it is necessary to involve not only our students, but also the community in which they live, especially their families. Only the collection of accurate data makes it possible to evaluate the impact that the work done has in our students' lives.

One of the tools used for this assessment is to conduct impact surveys - with a scale of grades ranging from **Very Weak (1)** to **Excellent (5)** —, with the aim of involving and getting to know better the people who play a fundamental role in complementing the **Academia dos Champs'** work.

- Benefits provided by the tennis lessons and in which circumstances
- Parents' willingness towards the continuation of the project
- Family's **feedback** about the sport itself

SUMMARY

The most recent school years have highlighted a constant motivation towards sports practice and a healthy lifestyle (with values ranging between 55 and 65 percent), among the main benefits that students get from Academia dos Champs. Approximately two-thirds of the parents or guardians who gave their feedback also consider that there was an improvement in the students' behaviour — a consequence which becomes more significant the longer the project is carried out in the communities in which it operates.



How long have you been a student at Academia dos Champs and how old were you when you started? How did you get to know the project?

I have been a student for five years and started playing when I was 14. I am currently taking two classes a week. I remember at the time hearing the school principal present the project and seeing some posters in school.

Do you remember what you did in your first tennis lesson at Academia dos Champs? What do you like to do most in classes?

How long have you been a student at Academia dos Champs and how old were you when you started? How did you get to know the project?

I joined Academia dos Champs at the age of 15, so I have been involved in the project for about two and a half years. At the time, I remember seeing some posters glued to the school's windows, and as classes were being held at my school, I decided to give it a try.

Do you remember what you did in your first tennis lesson at Academia dos Champs? How many times a week do you play tennis and what do you like the most in classes?

In the first lesson I remember having a conversation with my coach, then starting to hit forehands and backhands. These days, I take tennis lessons twice a week... I wish I had more lessons, but I realize it is not enough to want it for it to happen. In training I like all the drills, jumping rope, playing points and playing with my colleagues.

How important is it for you to have the opportunity to be part of Academia dos Champs and what values have you learned?

First of all, it gives me the opportunity to play a sport that I really like and that I first tried when I was seven years old. I had been playing since that age but then I moved abroad and I could not practice tennis anymore because lessons were too expensive in Portugal and my mother could not afford them. **Academia dos Champs** has given me this opportunity, and at the same time, helps me to improve values such as respect and punctuality, for example.

Would you like to work at Academia dos Champs one day, if you could, and thus be an example to the younger ones?

For me, the most important thing is to be a part of **Academia dos Champs**. If I could be a coach there one day, I would be very pleased to have that opportunity.


